The Florida Dance Performance Assessment was created to align the dance arts with the other arts organizations in the state of Florida. The evaluation process present dance educators with a summative form of assessment and gives validation to the dance programs aligned with the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. The results from the assessment will provide curriculum specialists, area superintendents, principals, fellow teachers, parents, and students with measurable data. The students will be evaluated in three categories: technical proficiency, movement acquisition, and ensemble performance. information for K-12 schools in our country that offer dance education (in any form). This information will be used later in January when NDEO sends out an FRSS-type survey (Fast Response School Survey) for Dance Specialists. The government typically does FRSS surveys across all academic subjects including the arts. However, the majority of arts' respondents are for music and visual arts. We believe that dance is underrepresented in these government surveys because the surveys often end up in schools that don't offer a dance curriculum. In an effort to improve our national voice, NDEO, along with a PhD candidate, will be implementing an FRSS-type survey in schools specifically known to have a dance curriculum. We just need to know exactly where to send the surveys to ensure maximum participation! Our goal is to accurately identify over 2,000 K-12 schools in the US that offer dance.

Remember, we need one form filled out for each school, so if you teach at multiple schools, you will need to fill out multiple forms. Make sure you input the school's mailing address, not yours.

Columba Bush Launches 2012-2013 Arts for Life! Scholarship Program

Tallahassee, FL - Columba Bush and the Foundation for Excellence in Education today launched the 2012-2013 Arts for Life! Program. Annually, Arts for Life! recognizes 25 graduating high school seniors from across Florida for outstanding achievement in the arts. Each recipient receives a \$1,000 cash scholarship toward their pursuit of the arts in higher education.

Columba Bush, Florida's First Lady from 1999-2007, is a passionate advocate for the arts and arts education. In 1999, she established Arts for Life!, a scholarship program to recognize the creativity and artistic talents of high school students throughout Florida. To date, the program has awarded scholarships to more than 325 gifted high school seniors representing the visual arts, dance, drama, music and creative writing.

To be considered for an Arts for Life! scholarship, students must:

Be a graduating high school senior from a public, private or home education program in Florida.

Submit a completed application, a brief essay explaining "How the arts have positively influenced my life" and a sample of their work in the visual arts, dance, drama, music or creative writing.

A committee of judges for each of the five disciplines, comprised of respected experts, reviews and scores the students' essays and work samples. Scholarships are given to the top scorers in each discipline and will be awarded in the Spring of 2013.
