National Education Association (NEA) Learning and Leadership Grants. Funding is available in two categories: (1) individual grants to fund participation in high-quality professional development experiences such as summer institutes or action research, and (2) group grants to fund collegial study, including study groups, action research, lesson study, or mentoring experiences for faculty or staff new to an assignment. All professional development must improve practice, curriculum, and student achievement. Applications are reviewed three times per year, every year. Applicants must be practicing U.S. public school teachers in grades Pre-K through 12, or public school education support professionals, or faculty and staff at public higher education institutions. Preference will be given to members of the National Education Association. Award: \$2,000 for individuals and \$5,000 for groups. Deadline: 10/15/2013. [***Click her for more information.***](#)

Surdna Foundation Thriving Cultures Program: Artistic Communities. This program honors and celebrates the artistic impulse as part of community behavior and as a way to strengthen community identity and cohesion.
